HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Enclosed with this Vail's Voice is your first quarter bill of 2022. There is a raise in quarterly fees so please, if your bank sends payment for you, contact them about the change in payment. Also, they will need to pay the difference with the raise. I ask that you pay your bill exactly for how much is on invoice. In April, I will be applying any credits that you have for overpaying and will be informing you how much extra you owe for paying the incorrect amount. Please write check correctly.

You will be seeing work being done on our catch basins. That is work coordinated by East of Hudson Watershed Corporation and includes installation and maintenance of proposed stormwater retrofit project. This is not costing Vail's Grove anything. The Corporation will provide an annual cleaning and filter replacement to ensure the project continues to function as intended. This will provide increased water quality for Peach Lake and the NYCDEP watershed.

Invoices will be sent out in January for 2022 North End Storage. Payment is due at the end of January. At the end of January, if there are any watercraft in the North End not paid for, not being claimed, or not belonging to a Vail's Grove resident, the Grove will plan to remove them.

Very important: If anyone other than you is staying in your home for more than 30 days, either continuous or on an accrued basis, they must be vetted. The first day they are in your home is the first of 365 days in which they can be here more than 30 days. You were vetted prior to moving into Vails and everyone must be vetted. This is for the safety of all. The office has a form to be completed and you need to submit a check for \$120. This is a new rule in the rules and Regulations.

Hi Everyone. This Newsletter comes with the hope of a less stressful winter season. Let us continue to do all we can to follow the CDC guidelines for a safe community environment.

As we enter into the winter season, again I would like to remind everyone to bring your garbage pails back to your homes and not leave them curbside. We must have our roads free and ready for snow plowing. We have also noticed recycle bins out days before pick up; with the winds that often blow during these winter months, recyclable items, especially cardboard boxes, have been blowing around in the middle of our narrow streets causing havoc, and some actually land in our lake. We would like to definitely avoid this.

It is a Vail's Grove By-law that there is no parking on the streets at any time. This rule is especially relevant during the winter months.

Please pick up after your pets, and remember your dogs must be walked on a leash. If you want to have your dogs run free, you can do so at the northend field near the tennis courts. There are multiple "doggie waste bag stations" along Lake Shore for your convenience. Part of owning a dog is the responsibility of picking up after them. Your neighbors should not have to step in, drive through, smell or have their pets subject to your dog's waste. Please be considerate.
