 now. No part of your or a guest's vehicle can be on the road. Parking is available in the common area lots,
 some fire roads, at the pavilion or down at the North End. Please do not block anyone's driveway, or park in
 areas where No Parking signs are.
- No open flames are allowed at the playground or the beach, so no firepits please.
- All dogs, regardless of size need, to be on a leash and under the full control of the person walking the dog.
 Keep in mind that not everyone is a dog lover, and some people and children may be frightened by your dog.
- You, the homeowner, are responsible to maintain the land that your home is on; please keep your grass cut and your property looking nice. No one wants to live next to a junk pile
