

Due to the recent storms that have occurred over the past year and a half, the Vail's Grove Board of Directors have approved the installation of an EMERGENCY ACCESS ROAD at the North End of Vail's Grove. This road will connect from the service road entrance at the Water Treatment plant that branches off from Maple Avenue, to the road that leads to the Boat Storage area at the end of Lake Shore Drive. It was decided unanimously by the Board that there needed to be another way out of Vail's Grove in case of partially (or fully blocked roads) from Ramp 3 (Becker's Way) to the end of Lake Shore Drive. Most recently, Hurricane Sandy toppled many trees and a few power poles, one of which was partially blocking Lake Shore Drive for approximately 7 days. Although there were only a few homes that were slightly compromised during this time period, the situation could have been much worse. Access to the Pump House, emergency access to those who may have needed it, etc. would not have been possible if the road was completely blocked, not to mention NO way IN or OUT of Vail's Grove for those residents. Such a situation would have affected work, school, basic food shopping, etc. due to a road blockage for those residents. So, at long last, in case of an emergency, there will not be a way IN and a way OUT at both the South end and the North end of Vail's Grove. Once again, this road will be only an EMERGENCY ACCESS ROAD and will be used on an AS NEEDED basis. The road will be blocked off from normal traffic with a lock and chain. There will be a key available at the Vail's Grove Office as well as with several residents of Vail's Grove still to be determined. After the winter weather has left our area for the year, construction of the road will begin and will most likely be ready sometime in April of this year. If you have any questions regarding the location and use of the road, please do not hesitate to contact the office.



The Board of Directors has made good progress in facilitating the installation of the new generator at the Pavilion. All appropriate permits and variances are in place. Installation of this generator, (which will supply the pavilion with power, heat and air conditioning) will necessitate moving our large propane tank to be buried behind the monument flag pole. This is mandated by the state and the North Salem Building department, as a safety requirement, because the current location is a "high water zone". All residents of Vail's Grove can benefit from the new generator. Keeping warm or cool in the event of a loss of power, as well as having a place to charge phones, computers, etc. are all positive attributes
