Office News From Cindy

WELCOME SPRING!!!!!

Enclosed with this Vail's Voice is your 2nd Quarterly bill. Please pay the amount on the bill, including any amount I have added. Many people paid less than the bill last quarter. Even though the \$50 assessment is gone, the budget was raised by 2% and a lot of residents missed that. If you have not done so already, please submit North End Storage payment by April 15. We will start checking at that time and if need be, boats/trailers not paid for will be removed and you will be charged. In a few weeks, the Dock Slip applications will be ready. I will put it on the website www.vailsgrove.us. There will be a date that you will need to return it by along with dock payment. If you have something in the North End that the office doesn't know about, please let me know so I can add to the list.

Speeders will start being fined. If you are seen speeding through the Grove, you will get a warning letter and will then start getting fined. It is so dangerous on these narrow roads – especially now that the weather is nice.

Many people here at the Grove have cameras on their homes. Please PICK UP after your dogs – fines will start if you are not. People look at these cameras and inform the office of folks not picking up. Remember that the office needs to get a copy of your renewal for Oil Tank Insurance. This is required. The office is updating our robo-call system. If you want to receive Robo-calls, you MUST, whether you are already on it or not, call me, e-mail me, send a note, whatever by April 29th with the phone number you would like to receive a phone call on. This system will go out to everyone at the same time. (Too many people have moved or changed numbers, etc. – and I want to start from scratch). This is going to be great!!!

Office will be closed April 14 and 15.

If anyone is interested in becoming a certified Water Operator for Vails Grove, details on how to do so are available in the office.

Anyone who paid their 2022 NE Storage fees, will have their sticker included in the April mailing. Please check your envelope. Please put the sticker on your trailer – if no trailer, put it on your boat.

AND LAST BUT NOT LEAST -



Emergency Response Committee by Jill Olimpieri

The Emergency Response Committee is here to assist the Vail's Grove community when storms take out our power in the grove. The pavilion will be made available for all residents and those with individual medical needs. Operating hours for the pavilion during an extended power outage will be **7am-10pm** for outages that are forecasted to last greater than 12 hours. The building will open and remain open for the designated hours of operation to charge electrical devices, watch tv, use freezer/refrigerator, and to keep warm in winter and cool in summer.

- If a power outage occurs at 3am and is forecasted to be restored in 24 hours, the pavilion will be opened at 7am that morning and close at 10pm. The pavilion would reopen the next morning if power was not restored.
- -If the power outage occurs between 7am-10am and is forecasted to be longer than 12 hours, the pavilion will be opened immediately and run-on operating hours.
- -If a power outage occurs which is forecasted to only last 9 hours, the pavilion will not be opened.

Boat Ramp/North End Storage by Patrick McGuinness

Greetings all and welcome to another boating season here on Peach Lake! As the thaw continues, many of us will be getting ready to put our vessels back in the water so, as always, here are reminders to help with the transition from land to sea.

- There are several of us in the Grove who have keys to access the North End as well as the boat ramp. Current list of key holders is available through the office. PLEASE be considerate when contacting those who have keys. On their behalf, please DO NOT call before 10am or after 9pm unless a particular individual gives you permission to do so. Please try to do your best to arrange for a key the day before you need it.
- It is requested that all key holders have a sign in/return sheet to keep track of those who take keys. This will be essential as we have many new members of the community who will be utilizing them and there are only a limited number of keys available. Additionally, this assures us that the areas are only being used by Vails residents. If any key gets lost or is not returned, it increases the potential of unauthorized access (which can obviously lead to other things...) to both the North End and the Boat Ramp. So please, follow your keys.
- After accessing North End and/or Boat Ramp, please be sure and lock gates <u>immediately</u> when you are through and return key(s) when finished same day.
- When removing and returning any trailers, please return your trailer to the <u>SAME</u> location it was originally placed at the North End. While there are not necessarily designated areas per say, this will minimize any confusion and still maintain order to the area. Thanks in advance for assisting with this.
- ALL vehicles in North End will be checked for VAILS GROVE TAGS. Only those paying storage fees are allowed to
 park in the North End. If boats that are no longer usable are still in there and not paid for, they will be removed
 and you will be charged.
- PLEASE refrain from parking any trailers OUTSIDE of the North End Gate.
- Prior to launching your vessel into the lake, please clean your hull to help avoid any contaminants entering into the water.

For those of you new to this process, it normally goes very smoothly with communication, coordination, patience and consideration of your fellow neighbors embarking on the same land to lake journey! Most importantly, BE SAFE!! HAPPY SAILING ALL and SEE YOU ON THE HIGH SEAS!!


