Dave Bruen and Ken Sullivan have coordinated a project to resurface the end of the ramp in the shallow water. As many of the boaters know, it has been quite tricky to launch your boat into the lake. The uneven ramp surface has been leveled and it should be much easier to launch your boat this season.
