### NOTES FROM THE CHAIR . . . .

There are lots of new beginnings to report on this spring. The restoration of the North End of the Lake has started, with much of the punch list to be completed. When it is finished, we hope to have new smooth roads, a clearing of all construction debris, and newly seeded areas of grass, an area to be used for storage of leaf and tree debris as well as mulch. Because of current DOH guidelines, the area that we anticipated using will not be available because of its proximity to our wells. The new leaf storage area will be cordoned off (probably with a shrubbery or tree screen), on a small portion of the ball field near the road leading to the Boat Storage area. A designated wetland area prevents us from using the rear of the ball field.

The Pump House Committee continues to actively research our options or the selection and placement of new water storage tanks. We will bring this information to the Board as soon as it is ready. Once there is sufficient information available on the cost the Finance Committee will plan the financing of this integral part of our infrastructure.

As some of you may already know, Michael Davies has resigned as the Chairman of the Buildings & Grounds Committee. He initiated and completed many projects that have improved the Grove including the dock configuration at the Pavilion, the refinishing of the Pavilion floors by Jay Moore, cleaning out our garages, and other projects too numerous to itemize. We thank him as a community for his service.

The Aesthetics Committee is off to a slow start due partly to our rainy weather and also to my being away in Alaska with my daughter and grandsons. When I return, I hope to be able to rely on former helpers to assist with plantings around Vail's Grove.

Finally the season is upon us when we will be looking for new members to serve on the Vail's Grove Board. I hope that you will consider running for one of these important positions on the Board. It is an opportunity to give back something to your community.

WWTP

Grinder pump contracts were awarded May 24th.

The D-day for the start of grinder pump
installation is June 15th. There will be two
different contractors handling our community.

Landscape Unlimited will be doing the work in
the 53 homes in North Salem and Joken Development Corp. will be doing the work for the 120
homes in Southeast. Contractors will be
contacting residents directly for the scheduling of
this installation. Homeowners MUST be present contacting residents directly for the scheduling of
this installation. Homeowners MUST be present
when access to their homes is needed. Once the
Grinder Pump is installed, your septic system
will be pumped out by the District septic
contractor and then decommissioned that same
day and you will be hooked into the sewer
collection system immediately. All electrical
systems must be brought up to the required
standards as of the day the installation will be
done. If you have any questions or concerns,
please contact an electrical contractor.

Any delays to this process will result in a "Delay
Claim Cost" from the contractor to the District.
Homeowners are responsible to not only schedule
their appointments when the contractor calls,

their appointments when the contractor calls, but to keep this appointment or it will delay the contractors schedule for that day. This will, in turn force the District to pay a Delay Claim to the contractor, and will be passed on to the resident directly. This is necessary for this cess to be able to move in a timely manner. Again, while the site of your grinder pump will be restored to "reasonable condition", the week that it is installed, seeding may not happen until the end of the project.

Many people have expressed how excited they are that this decade long process is coming to the reality of being complete. The current Board of Directors and past Boards have worked very hard on the Groves behalf to bring this project to its fruition. Our entire community at large should give themselves a pat on the back for all the help and support you have given in this endeavor.

Children under the age of 10 are not to be left unattended. If your child is over 10, you should discuss with a lifeguard if your child is a strong enough swimmer to be left unattended. Parents are responsible for their children and guests. The lifeguards are assigned to promote water safety. If at anytime, the lifeguard enforces a rule we ask that you respect his or her decision. The lake will be open weekends from 10am-7pm and daily starting June 13. If you are interested in private swimming lessons, please schedule with individual lifeguards. There will be an additional fee.
