As a reminder, our Rules and Regulations speak to Refuse and Exterior Maintenance. Stockholders are required to maintain the exterior of their home in a neat and orderly manner. Where the exterior of a Stockholders home suffers from deterioration, neglect of grounds, such as lawn maintenance, debris accumulated or an overall unsightly appearance, the Stockholder will be notified by the office to correct any deficiency. A reasonable amount of time will be allowed for the correction, but failure to act on the deficiency by a Stockholder of their home exterior will result in a violation of this rule and an improper use fee will be issued. Vail's Grove Cooperative would like to thank you in advance for your continued participation in our beautification efforts.

All Shareholders should check to see if they need to update their Oil Tank Insurance Policies. Many have expired or are about to expire. The office needs to have a copy of your policy in their files.

Septic Inspections - Septic Inspections are good for 2 years. If you are planning on selling your home, and your septic tank has been inspected within the 2 years prior to the new closing, another inspection will not be required as long as the office receives the proper inspection report.

All boats that are moored at Cooperative docks need to be registered with the office. If you haven't already done so, stop by and give Cindy your name and address, the location of the dock, and a description of your boat. Boats can drift away, and this will help get them back to the proper owner in a timely manner. If you have more than one boat, you can always moor them away from the docks, in order to allow room for all who may want dock space. Your boats should be registered by now, so please stop by to see Cindy.

# The Towns of North Salem and Southeast Formally Agree To Work Together To Preserve Peach Lake - Peggy Boyle

On May 22, the Town of North Salem signed the Inter-Municipal Agreement (IMA) to work with the Town of Southeast in forming a Sewer District to preserve Peach Lake. This monumental move forward occurred four days after Supervisor Globerman met with the Peach Lake Coalition, the WWTP Subcommittee and members of PLEC at the Vail's Grove Pavilion.

Also present at the local meeting which took place on May 18th was Councilman Paul Johnson of the Southeast Town Board. He felt that at his next meeting in early June, his Town Board would have no problem with the newest version of the IMA, which incorporated the ideas of homeowners around Peach Lake. On June 7th, the Town of Southeast unanimously agreed to approve the IMA.

### This is a major victory in our efforts to preserve Peach Lake.

This IMA was long in coming and many shareholders were dismayed that the April 10th Public Meeting at our Pavilion did not see its finalization after many years of working on this initiative. However, since that public meeting, both towns and their representatives worked diligently with the Peach Lake Coalition representatives, all of whom were determined to have this piece of the process completed well before the summer.

Fran Ott of Pietches Gardens Cooperative expressed her joy in her email announcement to many local residents, as she and members of the Coalition witnessed the IMA being approved in North Salem.

### WWTP update cont.

Margaret Flannery of our Vail's Grove was equally enthused to send out notice to all Peach Lake Coalition members, reporting that the Town of Southeast also approved the IMA, as promised at our meeting only two weeks before. Many Vail's Grove residents were present at this special meeting in Southeast to see the IMA finalization.

However, we cannot rest. The 10 million dollars earmarked for this project from Westchester County has not yet been released. Larry Schwartz, Assistant Westchester County Executive sent a detailed letter to the Town of North Salem, indicating that there are other groups interested in projects and that we need to provide more concrete information in order for Westchester County to prioritize the Peach Lake Sewer District. The Peach Lake Coalition and each Cooperative sent letters to Mr. Schwartz indicating our need for the funds and copied into the correspondence many local and state representatives. In the meantime, the Peach Lake Coalition and the Vail's Grove WWTP Subcommittee are anticipating that Hahn Engineering will finalize the Map, Plan and Report before summer's end. This Map, Plan and Report, which is well underway, is the next part of the process to form the sewer district and represents the nuts and bolts of the project. Our Board President, Tom Duffy, has met with Jim Hahn of Hahn Engineering to discuss the site specifications and stake out the boundaries of the proposed site. Several members of the Board toured the area to be considered for the site in late June, and another tour for all shareholders will be arranged in mid July. A survey will be conducted by the Vail's Board of all shareholders in July as well, regarding the formation of the sewer project. We must continue to move steadily in order to insure that the funds are released to this initiative.

Most importantly, the Town of North Salem and the Town of Southeast, as evidenced with this finalized IMA, are working together WITH local homeowners. The Vail's Grove community has to again be commended for taking the lead in gently but persistently insisting that we all want to be involved in every step of the way and that we are no strangers to work.


### WWTP update cont.
