The Peach Lake Coalition continues to "spring" forward in 2009!

Our Peach Lake Coalition Chairperson, Tom Duffy and Coalition member, Charlie Voelkl from NWCC attended a meeting on March 7. At that meeting, they met the new Supervisor of North Salem, Warren Lucas and Southeast Supervisor Michael Rights. The group discussed and updated project schedules and the bidding process and strategies of the Sewer Project designed to preserve Peach Lake and our homes. This hours long meeting, which took place in the Southeast Town Hall, helped to keep the momentum moving forward and we remain on schedule to break ground this fall. The bid packages for the construction of the waste water treatment plant and the collection system will go out in late April. Since there is some evidence that we may qualify to apply for NYS stimulus funds the Peach Lake Coalition is working with the Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) to try to design innovative conservation projects in an effort to secure additional monies to possibly lower the cost of the overall project. We have sent letters to the Governor and his special Stimulus Fund Cabinet as well as all of our elected officials on a local, state and national level. Even though we have already received over 12.5 million(from Westchester and Putnam) in funds and zero interest short term financing for this project, we remain hopeful to secure more funds to keep this initiative affordable. The Peach Lake Coalition will host a meeting here at Vails Pavilion welcoming our new North Salem Town Supervisor to the table in early April. Southeast Town Supervisor Michael Rights and EFC liaison Fred Testa will be in attendance as well. The Coalition continues to have that spring in its step, thanks to the dedicated leadership on our Vail's Grove Board and the entire Peach Lake Coalition. The efforts of the Peach Lake Coalition are reported on at each Vail's Grove Board meeting should there be any further questions. All are encouraged to attend.
