All you need to do is store the number of a contact person who should be contacted during an emergency under the name "ICE." Emergency personnel know to look for this in cell phones. This applies to the use of firecrackers and other fireworks in the Grove at any time and this should be noted especially during Holiday weekends like the upcoming Fourth of July. Fireworks are against the law in New York State and law enforcement officials may be called if this is a problem this year.
