On Sunday, September 14, the Vail's Board of Directors held its 2025 Annual Meeting. This important meeting closes out the past year's business and finalizes the election of board members whose terms have expired. We're happy to share that the following incumbents were re-elected for three-year terms: David Janecek, Pat McGuinness, Ellen Mytych, and Jason LaRocca. In addition, Todd Cammisa was newly elected to the 2025–2026 Board, also for a three-year term.

A special congratulations goes to David Janecek, who received the Chairperson's Service Award for 2025. After more than 10 years of dedicated service on the board, David has been an extraordinary volunteer. His commitment and guidance with our long-term planning document have helped us accomplish so much this year. We also want to welcome back Todd Cammisa, who wasted no time jumping in to help. Todd has already started revitalizing the north end ball field, aiming to create a space for young families to enjoy. He also rolled up his sleeves to replace the door at the garages near the Pavilion.

Speaking of the Pavilion and surrounding grounds, you'll notice ongoing cleanup and repairs in the coming months. To support this effort, we ask that all kayaks, canoes, rowboats, and other personal items currently stored at the Pavilion, co-op right-of-ways, or fire roads be moved to your own property no later than October 31, 2025. Some of these items have been sitting untouched for years, and clearing them away will help keep our community looking its best.

We've also added new tables and umbrellas to the playground. Thanks to Liz Getter's generosity towards the basketball court, a new bench and a sports box for equipment will soon be available for all to enjoy. William Gouin also deserves a huge thank-you for donating the painting of the basketball courts—and for sharing his delicious peaches and apples with our community!

The tennis courts are nearly finished! Fencing and painting should be wrapped up in the coming weeks. We're also exploring a key card system to help keep our new courts secure while remaining accessible.

Looking ahead, there will be opportunities to support PLEC, which works hard to combat the growing weed issue in our lake. Healthy lake water doesn't just benefit waterfront homes—it helps protect the property value of every home in Vail's Grove. We encourage everyone to give what they can, in whatever way feels comfortable.

And finally, as autumn days grow shorter and evenings darker, please remember to drive slowly through our neighborhood. Children are often out on scooters, bikes, and on foot, and we want everyone to stay safe.

Boat Ramp/North End Storage

Our annual migration from lake to North End is under way. Please be respectful and careful regarding the property of others as this transition takes place. As always, you are strongly encouraged to take a walk down to the north end prior to moving trailers to avoid any issues when you are ultimately ready to store. All dues must be paid in full prior to use at the north end. Forms for north end storage are in glass enclosure at the office. Please complete fully and mail or put in box in door if it is after office hours. Cindy will mail sticker to you or stop in the office. Waterproof stickers with waterproof numbers assigned to each owner will be given out to apply to trailers, boats, jetskis, etc. Additionally, contact name and phone number must be CLEARLY visible, written either on the wraps or directly on the frame of your trailer in the event you need to be contacted for ANY reason. Failure to do so could result in improper use fine. The north end is now storing at full capacity so contact info, patience and cooperation are of the utmost importance. We want everyone that takes advantage of the north end to be able to have peace of mind knowing their property is safe. Please DO NOT move anyone else's trailer(s) without permission and prior notification with the owner. Please adhere to all the rules and regulations as written on the signs posted at the entry gates and on the tree in the yard. Names and contact information of all owners are available at the office during working hours if needed. Thank you in advance for all of your cooperation.

All boats must be removed from Vail's Grove community docks no later than October 25, 2025. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

There are no issues with the operation of our pump house or our water supply thanks to the daily testing and monitoring provided by VRI. 
