Vail's Grove Forms Boat Ramp and Storage Committee

As a result of our Chairperson Ronnie Waltzer's initiative to firm up the Rules & Regulations regarding stockholder use of the Boat Ramp and Storage Facility at the North End of Vail's Grove, the Board of Directors recently approved an addition to the Rules & Regulations governing use of these facilities. This included the formation of a Boat Ramp and Storage Advisory Committee.

The goals of the new Rules & Regulations include protecting stockholders' property, in this case their water craft, from vandalism and/or theft by securing the gates to the Boat Ramp and the Storage Facility; protecting Peach Lake from unwanted organisms that can be brought in on boats from other lakes; protecting Vail's Grove Cooperative from liability in all matters relative to these two areas; and preventing unauthorized use of the Boat Ramp and the Storage Area. These Rules & Regulations will be published shortly.

The new Committee has met twice since August to discuss ways to make use of the Boat Ramp and Storage Facility safer and more convenient for stockholders while continuing to meet the goals set forth above. Some of the initiatives already undertaken include the "Boats In/Boats Out" days to be held in the Fall and Spring of each year to aid stockholders in getting their boats in and out of the lake and storage area; cleaning up of the large storage area at the North End; the development of processes for registering boats to be stored and signs to be posted at the gates to the two areas to direct Vail's Grove boat owners as to how to utilize these facilities.

Currently, Victoria Desidero is Chairing this Committee and stockholder participation is welcome. Committee members are Dave Bruen, Bruce Blackwell, Jay Couillard, Jim Cull, Jack Keiley, Sam Mullins, John Myers, Dennis Ryan, Ken Sullivan, Ronnie Waltzer and Fred Witte.

If you are a boat owner and need to get your boat into storage for the Winter, contact the Office to make an appointment or pay attention to the notice areas at the mailboxes for the posted dates for Storage Area access.



BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS -JACK WALTZER



The North End has been cleared for boat storage thanks to the efforts of our Buildings and Grounds Man, Jay Moore, who was ably assisted by Jay Couillard and Jack Keiley, further assisted by the loan of Ken Sullivan's "quad" which was used for towing stored trailers out of the way of the brush cutting. Thanks, neighbors, for contributing! Residents are reminded that boats to be stored at the North End require a Vail's Grove "sticker" available from the Office.

The Autumn Season is here, and the leaves and some deadfall will shortly be coming down. Residents are reminded that leaves must be placed within ten feet of the roadway **IN BIDODEGRADABLE BAGS** (FYI - for your convenience, Jay has biodegradable bags available for purchase at the same price as Home Depot). Jay adds the leaves to our compost pile. If you use a contractor, the contractor is responsible for removing the leaves, or for placing and bagging them properly.

Unbagged leaf piles will NOT be removed!

Tree limbs, boughs, branches and other biodegradable "stuff" must also be within ten feet of the raod, and cut to approximately four feet in length for Jay to take away. If you can't lift it, Jay can't get it into the truck! If you have questions regarding a particular item, Call Jack Waltzer or the Buildings and Grounds Office to determine whether we will remove "it". HINT: There is nothing better for your lawn than just mulching your leaves with a mower where they fall, and letting the leaf "dust" winter over...it just recycles all those nutrients into your grass naturally.

A request from the **P**each **L**ake **E**nvironmental **C**ommittee - If anyone uses your boat to "party", PLEASE have them take a trash bag along for the ride. Remind them that the tossing of trash, cans and bottles into our lake is not only unsightly, but can be potentially dangerous to swimmers, "tubers" and water skiers. If you were to hit one of these objects at speed, it would ruin your whole day. Our lake should not be treated as a garbage can.

The snowplowing season will follow Autumn, and the Grove will be placing markers in those places where the plow needs to be extra careful in order to avoid damaging swales, berms, and/or curbs. Advise Buildings and Grounds if you are aware of a spot that requires a marker.

Peach Lake Preservation Efforts Continue to Successfully Fall into Place! Submitted by Peggy Boyle

The EFC (Environmental Facilities Corporation) Board of Directors approved the financing for North Salem and Southeast on 9/10. The last approval needed is from the Public Authorities Control Board (PACB). They will be meeting on 9/17. In the meantime, EFC continues to target 9/25 as the closing date for the financing. EFC has already sent finance documents to the Town representatives for review and execution. After EFC receives the executed documents from the Towns and determines everything is in order, EFC will be ready to execute them, pending PACB approval.

The Peach Lake Coalition will meet on Sept 29 at the Vail's Pavilion from 2:00-3:30 p.m. There will be representation present from each of the lake community boards in the sewer district as well as North Salem Town Supervisor Paul Greenwood, Sarah Cwilka from Stearns and Wheler and Fred Testa from EFC. Local leadership will be encouraged to meet one hour earlier (1:00) to discuss the agenda. Fred Testa, our liaison with EFC will be recognized for his extraordinary assistance to the Peach Lake community for many years at the meeting.

The agenda will include reviewing and updating, if necessary, the timeline set forth this past spring by Stearns and Wheler. Strategies will be developed in anticipation of any obstacles in the permitting, design and bidding process. Since NYCDEP and NYSDEC can at times take a long time to approve permits etc..., we may entertain having a meeting with these officials down the line, so as to keep the process moving.

In following up with the suggestion of Jack Byrne from Pietsch Gardens, we will discuss the formation of a subcommittee to investigate the problematic weed situation. Allied Biological, Inc., has had a history of treating Peach lake for this condition, and has been in touch with Coalition members at Mr. Byrne's suggestion. There is a concern that even though the carp have made tremendous progress in curbing weed development, there are pervasive weeds like milfoil, which carp don't eat. The future WWTP will curb future weed development as it will dramatically lesson the nutrient level, but the established weed beds need to be addressed. This item will be discussed at our 1:00 planning meeting.

We welcome new leadership in the subcommittee and the Peach Lake Coalition and would especially ask that board members, in particular new board members, join us in the efforts to preserve Peach Lake.

The meeting on the 29th of September is taking place exactly one year since the Autumn Evening Celebration and we have much to show for in a year's time!



The office would like to remind you that <u>before</u> you begin any renovations or alterations, you should take some time and review the Vail's Grove By-Laws and Rules and Regulations. The By-Laws and Rules and Regulations are available for you to read or download from the Vail's Grove website,

The deadline for any additions, deletions or changes to our 2008-2009 Vail's Grove Directory is October 15th. This year you have the option of having your e-mail address published in the directory as well!

If you would like to advertise your business (which is how the directory is paid for), the fee is a very reasonable \$25. Anyone wishing to advertise should please submit their business card and \$25 to the office by October 15th. Remember to support these businesses!


A REMINDER FOR DOG OWNERS - AGAIN
